



Beekeeping for Veterinarians Workshop

The Beekeeping for Veterinarians Workshop will be held on Friday, July, 27, 2018 from 9:00 a.m.- 4:00 p.m. at the Purdue Apiary, located at 2255 IN-26, West Lafayette, IN 47906. The agenda will focus on the veterinarian's role in beekeeping and will provide veterinarians with the skills needed to work with beekeeping clients. Topics include honeybee biology, honeybee diseases, disease prevention/treatment, and basic beekeeping skills. The program will also provide an opportunity for hands-on training on bee hive management. Gear will be provided, but participants should wear pants, long sleeves, and close-toed shoes.

Registration is required. The course is open to veterinarians and veterinary students, but is limited to 40 participants. This workshop is brought to you by the Purdue College of Veterinary Medicine and the Purdue Department of Entomology.
